### PROFILE



I am an Australian concert pianist, accompanist, teacher of music theory, ear training and piano, and music researcher. As a pianist, I have performed in many significant concert series and festivals in the United States, Norway, Finland, and Australia. For the 2015-16 season, I was

the principal solo artist for L'Archet concert group based in East Stroudsburg University, USA, and have appeared regularly on their concert series since then. In addition to solo concerts I have regularly performed chamber music, and have collaborated with singers in opera and lied recitals.

My main focus as a holistic musician applies the knowledge of harmony and form toward shaping vivid and illuminating performances. My doctoral dissertation developed an approach to analyzing harmony and form in tonal music (c.1770-1850) based on the dynamic interplay of opposing forces. I strive to apply this research to my performing and teaching.
